Hep A is spread through:

- Contact with the poop of people who have Hep A, which can easily happen if someone does not wash his or her hands.
- There are really small poop particles around us all the time!
- Eating or drinking food and water contaminated with HAV.
- Unwashed hands

Vaccinations/Tips

If you inject or smoke drugs, have experienced homelessness, or were recently incarcerated you are at a higher risk of getting Hep A and now is a good time to get vaccinated! Any clinic should be able to offer vaccines.

Because HepA can spread between people, vaccines are important to limit the virus's ability to multiply. Vaccines make it so you can't get sick from it, and you don't need to worry about it!
